

**IOWA ARMY AMMUNITION PLANT
RESTORATION ADVISORY BOARD (RAB) MINUTES
21 JULY 98**

The Restoration Advisory Board (RAB) meeting was held 7:00PM on July 21, 1998 at Pzazzl, Burlington, IA. See Exhibit 1 for attendees.

Larry Orr, Community Co-Chairman, welcomed the members and guests, then called the meeting to order. Press Release Photos are rescheduled for the August meeting. Photos will be used in future RAB press releases and have been added to the new Internet RAB Web Site.

Larry extended a "thank you" to all who attended and participated in the Public Meeting which was held July 9, 1998.

Bob Christy resigned from the board due to other commitments. Larry challenged the board to be considering a course of action to increase membership. This action will be added to next month's agenda.

The agenda, Exhibit 2, was reviewed and accepted. Minutes from the July meeting were accepted. FY99 ER, A, Iowa AAP, Exhibit 3, was distributed. Rodger Allison, Army Co-Chairman, explained this is the final submission to IOC for the projects. The list shows the dollar figures as requested. The total is \$15,155,000 which is \$300,000 less than the submission last year. The allotment last year was \$3,000,000 and it is expected that IAAAP will receive approximately that same amount this coming year. IAAAP will be notified around October 1, 1998.

The issues pending which concern the Operating Procedures include the Executive Committee clause and the final approval vote. It was established that the committee members present did equal a quorum. Jeff Bergman moved to accept paragraph 2, Quorum, of the Operating Policy, definition of the executive committee. Eric Orth seconded. Unanimous.

Jeff Bergman moved to accept the Restoration Advisory Board Operating Policy, Exhibit 5. Kathy Christy seconded. Unanimous.

With some time before the next item on the agenda, Rodger asked the board to discuss ideas for criteria for recruiting members, such as targeting a specific group (safety engineers from various companies, minorities, economically challenged, etc), or age limits. It was suggested to check city or county groups and perhaps use them as a clearinghouse. A subcommittee to research/brainstorm criteria could be established. More discussion to follow as this action will be on next month's agenda.

Rodger opened the floor to questions/comments from the public. Jerry Pleasant and James Miller live south of the IAAAP and expressed concerns about the contamination found in their drinking water wells in 1993. They had to be hooked up to Rathbun water supply and now had to make monthly payments instead of being able to use their wells. They had submitted a claim for this cost which was denied by the Army. They indicated the Army had filtered their water many years ago and then stopped. They then performed the testing in 1993 and began providing bottled water to residents south of the IAAAP. Rodger pointed out the Army had provided an alternate water source by paying to hook up all residents who wished Rathbun water service. Mr. Miller indicated that was fine but some people could not afford the high cost of the new water source and asked what they were supposed to do. Rodger indicated the decisions that had been made thus far concerning this were at levels above the installation.

Rodger offered to help them get in touch with upper management. Mark Hagerla suggested that legislators would probably be their biggest help, since the RAB is only a liaison.

Jeff Bergman extended an invitation to Mr. Pleasant and Mr. Miller to join the RAB. "As you know, Kirk Hasenclever, who was our representative from south of the IAAAP, is no longer with us so we would encourage you both to join this committee." Eric Orth suggested they send us their questions/comments if they feel they don't have the time to become members.




Colonel Hewitt (IAAAP Commanding Officer) also encouraged Mr. Pleasant and Mr. Miller to become a part of the RAB.

Kevin Howe, COE, conducted a Cleanup Status Update. See Exhibit 4. He mentioned that the meeting is geared to regular board members but he would try to be as explicit as possible for the benefit of the public. In Exhibit 4 each project is itemized. The projected scope of work at the Fire Training Pit for late August through September would make it a good time to schedule another site visit. The soil excavation is scheduled for late August 1998. The Low Temperature Thermal Desorption (LTTD) Unit is scheduled to be here on 9/1/98.

It was determined to set September 15, 1998 for the next site visit. The time will be determined later, however, it provides Lori Landeche with enough information to begin the arrangements. Also, it was decided to move the August meeting from the third Tuesday to the fourth Tuesday, August 25.

Two items for next month's agenda are the Membership Committee and addressing membership issues.

With no further business, meeting was adjourned at 9:20PM.
