tions in the near future. The Remedial Investigation conducted by the United States Army Military Munitions Response Program at the Iowa Army Ammunition Plant is underway and will continue over the coming months. The initial phase of the investigation includes work on several acres located near the eastern boundary of the installation. Based on historical information recently gathered, the area was used as a disposal site in the 1940s.

Munitions-related items, which include unexploded ordnance and discarded military munitions, may be found as work progresses. Qualified technicians that are trained in safe handling and disposal of military ordnance will be removing munitions-related items from the ground surface of the work area. If technicians determine an item to be unsafe to move, it may need to be destroyed in place. Neighbors along the eastern boundary may hear noise from this operation. If the procedure is necessary, it will be conducted sometime around 4:00 PM of the day after the item to be destroyed is discovered. The Army will establish control measures to mitigate detonation and noise effects so there is minimal impact to the surrounding community.
